Government College, Dehra resolves to move forward to provide an educational environment so that students realize their full potential in their chosen discipline and attain quality education to face the challenges of future and serve the country and human community at large academically, technologically and culturally with sound human resources. w.e.f June 2017. Govt. College Dehra affiliated to HPU Shimls vide Notification No. No.-1-677/2017-HPU(Acad)-A dated 21st June 2017 and Re-affiliated to HPU Shimla vide Notification No. EDN-A _KA (1)-17/2021-L-1 dated 31st August, 2023. In between for the session 2022-23 this college being situated in Distt. Kangra was affiliated to SPU Mandi H.P vide Notification No. SPU- Mandi/ CDC/ 2022- 3387 dated 24th May, 2022. Currently, only the students of B.A/ B.Com 3rd Year for the Session 2024-25 are affiliated to SPU Mandi.

Dehra is the one of the oldest tehsil in Himachal Pradesh and its history traces back to the British regime and further the town of Dehra is cited as a place where traders and foreign invaders used this place as a DERA(Camp) for their expedition to hill states around early 17^{th} century. With times, it may possible that the name DERA got changed to DEHRA. The official name of the town during British Raj was *Dera; another version related to the nomenclature states that the name "DEHRA"* is because it has the temples of many gods and goddesses, including that of Radha-Krishana and "DEHRA" in *Pahari* means a *temple*. It was converted into a tehsil by the British in 1868 from where it started its journey of evolution and development.

The mythological existence of this small river side town is associated with Gopipur where afierce battle is said to be fought between Lord Krishna and the demon King Kalyavana on the other shore of river Beas. An ancient Pandav temple is the oldest temple in the town aging from the time of Mahabharta. Dehra is surrounded by the places of tourist interest. The town falls in the vicinity to the Holy shrines of Jawalamukhi (12 Kms), Chintapurani (20 Kms), Baglamukhi (12 Kms), Kaleshwar Mahadev (10 Kms), Muchkund Mahadev (12 Kms) and Dhundeshwar Mahadev (12 Kms) from Dehra. The first heritage village of Himachal Pradesh Garli-Pragpur (10 Kms), Chanour Thakurdwara Temple (18 Kms), Rock Cut Temple-Masroor (38 Kms) and Maharana Pratap Sagar (Pong Dam), Rock-cut temple at Musroor draws thousands of tourists Govt. College, Dehra is all set to work for the betterment of the society and welfare of the students with a vision that "All of us do not have equal talent but all of us have an equal opportunity to develop our talents." Various cultural, academic and sports activities are successfully organised throughout the year which is likely to increase the strength of the students in the college.

The student centric activities such as National Service Scheme (NSS), Red Ribbon Club, Rovers & Rangers, Road Safety club are gaining momentum throughout the year to this region. Dehra is the gateway to religious and adventure tourism in District Kangra.

With such kind of divine ambience around,. The college Magazine "VYAS-DHARA" has been successfully launched from session 2018-19.

At present college is being run on a makeshift arrangement in GSSS (Boys), Dehra. The School playground is open for our students as well. The Process of FCA is in progress and the day is not far when the students will have their own campus.

MODE OF ADMISSION

This year college has adopted the online mode of admission. Students have to get registered and fill the admission form online through college website i.e. www.gdcdehra.in. Admission to B.Com./B.A. 1st Year will be made strictly on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination (10+2). The reservation of seats of various categories and sub categories will be applicable as per the reservation roaster of H.PU. Admission to 2nd year and 3rd year will be on roll on basis. Roll on system means the student who has appeared in 1st year will go to 2nd year and appeared in 2nd year will go to 3rd year as per the schedule of admission without waiting for the result of 1st year and 2nd year.

RULE&PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION

Candidate seeking admission to this college is required to note the following instructions:

- (1) A student seeking admission shall be required to get registered for admission through college website www.gdcdehra.in and follow the steps for admission.
- (2) The entire particular in the prescribed admission form must be legibly and completely filled up by the candidate. Every student must have personal Email Id & Aadhar linked bank account.
- (3) Each applicant has to produce the following certificate/documents before the admission committee.(Self-Attested photocopies of the same are essentially to be attached):
 - a. Matriculation certificate:
 - **b.** Detailed Marks Sheet (Original) or Previous/Qualifying examination Passed; (10th & 12th)
 - c. Character certificate(original)from the head of the institution last attended;
 - d. Aadhar Card:
 - e. Proof of Aadhar linked bank account;
 - f. Two photo graphs of applicant and one Photograph of

- Father/mother/Guardian(all colored and passport size);
- g. Himachali Bonafide Certificate (Only for girl applicants);
- **h.** Category Certificate in case of SC/ST/OBC/Specially Physically disabled/sports/cultural capacity;
- i. Migration Certificate (in original), if +2 is passed from a board other than HP board.
- (4) After filling the online admission form candidate has to bring printed copy of all the documents attached with application form and will appear personally before the admission committee at the time of admission along with his/her Parents/Guardian (Guardian means only blood relation and not a student of this college in a case).
- (5) In case a student is allowed to join provisionally subject to the production of migration Certificate Eligibility Certificate, he/she shall continue his/her studies in this college entirely at her/his own risk.
- (6) After filling up the admission form in all respect to follow the due procedure, the student will appear before the admission committee.
- (7) The student whose name shall appear in the list of selected candidates is required to deposit the college dues in full as per the schedule. If any student fails to deposit the fee within stipulated time, his/her seat shall be treated as vacant and will be allotted to next student in the waiting list.
- (8) A student seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attached attested copy of disability certificate issued by the competent authority clearly indicating the extent of disability as per the requirement of university rules.
- (9) Admission will be purely on merit basis and the availability of number of seats in each stream.
- (10) Admission will be made by strictly adhering to fulfillment of eligibility conditions.
- (11) Those students who are placed under compartment in+2 examinations under H.P Board or any other Board held in March 2024 are not eligible to seek admission in 1styear of any stream.
- (12) A candidate who has passed/cleared all the five papers including English from the National Open School New Delhi is eligible to take admission in 1st year (vide letter no. 4-9/94 HPU (Acad) of dated April 29,2002. However, a candidate failed in any subject, out of five subjects is not eligible for admission as per university ordinance.

- (13) The candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Commerce stream shall be given reference in admission to B.Com programme.

 In case of gap of one year or more, after passing of qualifying exam, the applicant is essentially required to submit a self-signed declaration for justification of gap regarding intervening period between leaving the institution last attended and the date of admission in the college. In such case, a latest character certificate from the Panchayat Pradhan of the village concerned or any Gazetted officer shall also be required. (The Character Certificate must not have been issued more than six month prior to the date of admission)
- (14) Rules for admission are subject to change as per HPU/SPU notification (s) from time to time. Any changes regarding the rules governing admission shall be duly notified on the college notice board.
- (15) A student shall be liable for cancellation of his/her admission if he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false information and disciplinary action may be initiated against such candidates as per rules.
- (16) Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of a student has not been up to the mark during his course of studies in the college.
- (17) All admission shall be provisional whose regularization shall subject to final approval by H.P. University/ S.P.U.
- (18) One seat is exclusively reserved for single "Girl Child" of the parents in each stream in addition to usual number of seats.
- (19) One seat is exclusively reserved for ward of Kashmiri Migrants in each stream (Letter no. EDN- H (8)-4(1) 2001-GNEL).
 - Applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age on 01/07/2024 and must not have been born earlier to 01/07/2001 (01/07/1999). However, in case of overage candidate the Vice-Chancellor may allow age relaxation up to 6 months. In case of SC/ST age relaxation up to 3 years is allowed as per rules.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the student to choose courses from amongst the prescribed ones comprising Core, Elective, (Discipline Specific Elective Course (DSEs), Ability Enhancement Courses (AECCs), Skill Enhancement Courses (SECs) and Generic Elective Courses (GEs). Evaluation follows the grading system, which is considered to be better than the conventional marks systems. The uniform grading system in the entire higher education in India will benefit the students to move across institutions within India and across countries. In order to bring uniformity in evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for B.Com/B.A (Eligibility for Admission): A pass in the Higher Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P Board of school Education or an examination accepted as equivalent to that by the various bodies of the H.P University.

ELIGIBLITY FOR THE DEGREE: The candidates shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a college affiliated to H.P University for the period not less than three academic years (and not more than five academic years) and pass the examination prescribed and fulfill such conditions as have prescribed therefore. For the degree (B.A/B.Com), the student will have to cumulate a minimum of 132 credits successfully (44 credits for each year).

OUTLINE OF CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM: The UG programme in a college affiliated to the HPU will comprise the following categories of courses.

I Discipline Specific Core (DSC): A course, which should compulsory, be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core Course.

II Elective Core: Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of course sand which maybe very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline subject domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

- a. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered by the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline specific Elective course. The University/Institution may also offered discipline related Elective Courses of interdisciplinary nature(to be offered by main discipline/subject of study)
- **b. Dissertation/Project Work:** An elective courses of 6 credits, designed to acquire special/advanced Knowledge, such as supplements tudy/supports tudy to a project work, which a candidate studies on his own with an advisory support by at eacher/faculty member is called dissertation project work. A project/ Dissertation work may be again given in lieu of a discipline specific elective paper.
- c. Generic Elective Courses (GEC): An elective course chosen generally from anunrelated discipline/

Subject, with an intention to seek exposure to the subject discipline is called a Generic Elective Courses. A core courses offered in discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such elective may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

III. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)/Competency Improvement Courses Skill Development Courses/Foundation Courses: The Ability Enhancement(AE) Courses

May be of two kinds: AE Compulsory Courses (AECC) and AE Elective Courses (AEEC) ."AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement. These are [(1)Environmental Science,(II) English/MIL Communication are mandatory for all discipline .AEEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills to the students.

- **a. Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.
- **b. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) (minimum4):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based instruction.

CREDITS: The term credit refers to the weightage given to a course, usually in terms of the number of instructional hours per week assigned to it.

For the purpose of credit determination, instruction is divided into three components:-

- i.) Lectures(L):Classroom lectures of one hour duration.
- **ii.**) **Tutorials(T):** Special, elaborated instructions on specific topics(from Lectures) of one hour duration. It consists of participatory discussion/desk work/ problem solving/ brief seminar on a topic or any such other novel method that makes learners absorbed and assimilate more effectively the contents delivered in a lecture session.
- **iii.) Practical (P):**Field exercise in which the student has to perform experiments or other practical work of two hour duration Practice session consists of hands on experience / laboratory experiments/Field Studies/Case studies that equip students to acquire that much required skill component. Each one of these components considered as equal to one credit. One lecture (L) as well as one Tutorial (T)of one hour a week is considered as one hour Tutorials per week is considered as one credit. If T is the numbers of one hour Tutorials per week, and P is the numbers of two hour Practical's per week, the credit weightage for a particular course can be written as:- C=L+T+P. The total minimum credits require for an undergraduate degree programme is 132. Credits of a course also indicate the weightage of a course for calculating Grade Point Average (GPA). Through credits are not directly related to marks, as a thumb rule we may consider 1 credit = 25 marks.

COURSE EVALUATION

The CBCS evaluation system comprises of the following two components:

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and End-Semester/Year Examination (ESE/EYE)

Note: A student will have to pass both the components i.e. CCA and ESE/EYE separately with minimum 35Percent marks in each component to become eligible to be declared successful in a course. The overall pass percentage is 45 (Forty five percent)

1. CONTINUOUS COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT:

Continuous comprehensive assessment shall be carried out in the form of quizzes, assignments, group discussion, seminars, one minor test and shall be reflected in the syllabi for a course of study.

- **2. END SEMESTER /YEAR EXAMINATION (ESE/EYE):** The remaining 70% of the final grade of the student in a course will assessed on the basis of end year examination that will be for three hours duration and will cover entire syllabus of the course.
- **3. PROJECT WORK:** Project in any courses shall be for 100 marks and the 70:30 marking ratio shall be 30 marks for synopsis submission (CCA/Year) and remaining 70 marks (ESE) to be distributed as 50 marks for Dissertation +20 marks for Viva Voce.

LEAVE RULES

GENERAL LEAVE & DUTY LEAVE RULES:

Students are required to attend their classes regularly and punctually as soon as the time table is notified. Student(s) can proceed on leave only with a prior permission from concerned tutor after applying a leave proforma available in the college. Concerned tutor can recommend maximum leave up to 3 days. Senior tutor can recommend maximum leave up to 7 days. For a long leave i.e. for more than 7 days, student must get the application recommended by the concerned tutor and sanctioned by principal before proceeding on leave. The name of students who remains absent, without prior sanction of leave for six consecutive days, will be struck off from the college rolls automatically. Readmission is the sole discretion of the principal and it can be allowed within 10 days. However, under special circumstances/exceptional cases (having unavoidable situation and sufficient reason on the part of student to go on such leave), the Principal can consider such leave case on the special recommendation of tutor concerned. Leave for sickness must be accompanied by a medical certificate from the competent medical authority. Participation by the students in Sports/Cultural/NSS/Co-curricular activities/inter-college or university competitions shall be considered as duty leave (for the duration of respective competition(s) or activity) subject to the condition that it has been duly got recommended by the concerned activity in charge (s) and approved by the Principal before the concerned of such event.

LECTURE-ATTENDANCE: The students are essentially required to be punctual and regular in their classes according to the universities rules & every student must attend at least 75% Lectures both in theory

and practical separately which forms the basis of awarding internal assessment and granting permission for taking End-semester-Examination. The Principal can condone the shortage up to 10% in special deserving cases.

ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION

The college organizes Annual Prize Distribution Function towards the end of each academic session, date for which is duly notified well in advance. Prizes are awarded to those students who excel in the field of academics, sports, cultural, NSS and other Co-curricular activities.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE "VYASDHARA"

The college magazine "VYAS DHARA" is published on yearly basis to give expression to the creative writing and talent of the students. The magazine has four sections. Each section is edited by the student editor under the able guidance of staff editor appointed for this purpose.

Code of Conduct for Students

This code of conduct is meant for students of Government Degree College Dehra and students are abiding to follow this while they join our college and strictly adhere with.

- 1. Since, today's Student is tomorrow's good citizen, each Student is expected to show exemplary conduct, being polite, humble, civilized in his/her behaviour in and outside the college campus.
- 2. Abeyance of the college rules and regulations are compulsory biding to Students. Ignorance of rules and regulations/orders issued is no excuse.

- 8. Idle sitting on wayside leading to college, parapets, ramps and unauthorized places will constitute an act of indiscipline and special fine will be charged by the authority.
- 9. No Student is allowed to put posters/ undertake anti-social activities in college campuses/notice boards and not allowed to organize unlawful activities or addressing unauthorized assembly in the college campus.
- 10. Any body found guilty of writing obscene language on blackboard, walls or furniture of the college.
- 11. Student causing disturbance/ obstruction in the smooth functioning are liable for disciplinary action.
- 12. Any Student causing loss/damage to the college property shall be penalized and asked to make good the loss.
- 13. Silence is to be strictly observed in the library and optimal use of college library is expected from all students and they should observe the rules of library.
- 14. Student should appear in tests and midterm tests as per the direction of concerned teacher/tutor and these are part of CCA.
- 15. Whole admission process is online through the portal available on college website.
- 16. After the completion of online process student must submit the receipt of online fee slips for record and confirmation.
- 17. Students of second year and third year must deposit their class fee in stipulated time.
- 18. Smokings, drinking of alcohol, use of drugs, tobacco products are strictly prohibited in institution.

 Any indulgence in the said activities will entail strict disciplinary action/expulsion from the Institution.
- 19. Each Student is required to participate in the Sports Activities as per his/her capabilities.
- 20. For outside Campus Programmes /Educational Tours/Cultural Activities etc. Students must seek their guardian/parent's permission/consent to this effect.

ANTI-RAGGING AND DISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have zero tolerance for ragging and its total elimination in the educational institutions, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4thMay,2001,16th May2007 and 11th Feb,2009 has directed as here under:

- 1. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the institution.
- 2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiable harsh.
- 3. Punishment for ragging includes:
 - (i) Imprisonment/fine or both.
 - (ii) Expulsion from the institution, suspension from institution or classes for a limited period and fine with a public apology.
 - (iii) With holding scholarship or other benefits.
 - (iv) Debarring from representation in events.
 - (v) With holding results.
 - (vi) Suspension or expulsion from hostel or mess and the like.
- 4 If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment shall be resorted to.
- 5 Character/Migration certificate(s) issued by the institution shall have an entry apart from that of general conduct and behaviour to the effect whether the student had participated in ragging and in particular was punished for ragging.
- 6 In case the applicant is found to have indulged in ragging/indiscipline in the past or it is

noticed later that he/ she had indulged in ragging, his/her admission may be refused or he/she would be expelled from the institution forthwith.



Any student found involved in ragging will be punished strictly by the college authorities and such penalization may include:

- 1. Expulsion from the college.
- 3. Fine with a public apology.
- 5. The with a public apology.
- Debarring from the representation in events.
- With holding scholarships or other benefits.

2. Suspension from the classes.

6. Legal proceeding under criminal law shall be initiated. It include imprisonment for a term which may extend to 3 years or with fine which may extend to 50,000/- or with both.
